# Further strengthening of International Law Enforcement Coordination Units (ILECUs) Network in South-eastern Europe (SEE) and Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries

 Project completed

## About the Project

The ILECU project was built upon previous actions funded by the European Union that aimed to support the establishment of International Law Enforcement Coordination Units (ILECUs) in the Eastern Partnership and Western Balkan regions. It focused on enhancing collaboration through effective information exchange and joint law enforcement activities across neighbouring countries to combat transnational organised crime. The project targeted Ukraine, Moldova, Georgia, North Macedonia and Serbia.



### Partners

This MPF project was implemented by ICMPD on behalf of EU Member States Hungary and Romania and in collaboration with the International Law Enforcement Cooperation Centre (ILECC) and the National Directorate General for Aliens Policing (NDGAP) as observer in Hungary as well as with the Romanian Police.

## Activities



### Facilitation of Joint Cross-Regional Meetings and Workshops among Partner Countries

Cross-regional meetings were facilitated between law enforcement agencies from partner countries, convening higher-level management. These meetings served as platforms for identifying common opportunities and challenges and generating ideas to enhance ILECU operations, among other objectives. Through such activities, significant improvements were made in the flow and quality of information between the ILECU and other stakeholders, serving as a platform for relationship and trust-building, thereby laying a foundation for sustainable exchange and collaboration.



### Capacity Building for Staff Operating in ILECU

Targeted capacity-building activities were organised for staff members operating in ILECU to enhance harmonised working methods and closer cooperation. This component encompassed needs assessments, study visits at Interpol and Europol Headquarters and other EU member states, and workshops and capacity-building activities. To complement the capacity-building activities, a basic induction programme was developed to define a training and mentoring framework for new ILECU staff, aligning with EU requirements. This shared programme added value to the project, establishing a common frame of reference for communication and thus enhancing collaboration and operational effectiveness within the ILECU network.

## Provision of Equipment to ILECU

Following a dedicated needs assessment, minimal equipment was provided to facilitate interconnection and communication among partner ILECU offices in the target regions. Notably, the procurement of information and communication technology (ICT) equipment enabled ILECU to modernise their information exchange systems and processes, ensuring effective network communication. Such enhancements in communication infrastructure will allow quicker operational responses to shared challenges and threats, thereby facilitating the sustainability of exchanges beyond the project's duration.
